




How effectively did out-of-class work (assignments, readings, practice, etc.) help you learn?

How available was the instructor to provide help when needed (in person, by email, office hours, etc.)?






How much did the instructor motivate you to do your best work?



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

How much did the instructor emphasize student learning and development?






In a typical week, about how much time did you devote to this course? (Do not count scheduled class time, labs, etc.)

Comments

Dr. Dennis was very involved in the class discussions and willing to answer questions.

I liked that it provided an overall view of qualitative research from start to finish. I liked that Dr. Dennis was personable and allowed us to discuss our findings and dive in deeper into topics.

The clear structure for content accountability, and the quick/relevant feedback on submissions/postings. It was helpful to be redirected quickly for trickier concepts.

Her design of the course was very clear and strongly laid a foundation for the way the course proceeded and the course outcomes and requirements nd assignment requirements were well explained. Her knowledge of the subject matter; the way she explained course topics, clarified student questions and used wealth of personal experience to highlight and clarify content. And the manner— the wording and tone and scholarship she employed to do so.

What did you like least about this course and instructor?

Comments

It was hard to have the expectation of posting so many times a week when my group only had one other person in it. It kind of felt un-organic and forced to earn points.

The small groups, I wouldn't want more than 3–4 people in a group, but quality of conversation and learning depends on other's knowledge and willingness to engage. It doesn't always work. I don't have a better suggestion – I don't think it would be good to switch groups mid semester. Maybe some questions posed to the whole class and others to the group so input from a broader group of people can be seen/shared? Not a fault of the instructor.

It was just all good!

She tended to present her opinions as facts, she assigned assignments that scaffolded on one onother but didn't get them graded before the next scaffold was due, she asked leading questions that didn't welcome opposing discussion.

The timing and due dates of assignments. Students who work full time can not all complete readings and discussion during the week. Other classes in which the discussions were due at the end of the day on Sunday work much better.

Our grade for a weekly forum would be docked a point if the posts were not done across multiple days, even if the required number of posts were met and were "substantive." One week, I wrote out all my posts in a Word document, and posted two in one day. The next day, I brought my computer to work. On my lunch break, I went to my car, got out my computer, activated the hotspot on my phone, pulled up Canvas, then posted the other two responses, just so I would get full credit. This was really unnecessary and cumbersome for simply posting responses in an online forum.

The beginning of the semester, things were very unclear. In the syllabus it stated we needed to post 3 times. After the first week we were told we needed to post more than 3 times. After the second week we were told it needed to be over the course of multiple days.

The discussions encouraged us to share our views and opinions, as well as to seek out the understandings of others who view the world differently than we do.

Through the readings

Dr. Dennis allowed us to read a variety of texts that discuss differing backgrounds/views of the world. We also engaged in discussion boards to see others perspectives.

Through readings and reflective questions related to ethics, power structures and access to authors from marginalized backgrounds.

One of her focal areas is studying diversity which she blended well in to discussions and content related to the course. Diversity wasn't 'brought in' to the course. The course was founded on and designed by, for, with and of diversity.
